Ines Prelas has joined Dealer Sales. She is from Pueblo, single, and enjoys horseback riding, boating, swimming, tennis, cooking, and reading.


Venita Fae Daniel, Woodshop, lives in Penrose with her husband and two daughters, ages 13 years and 9 months. Her hobby is antiques.
