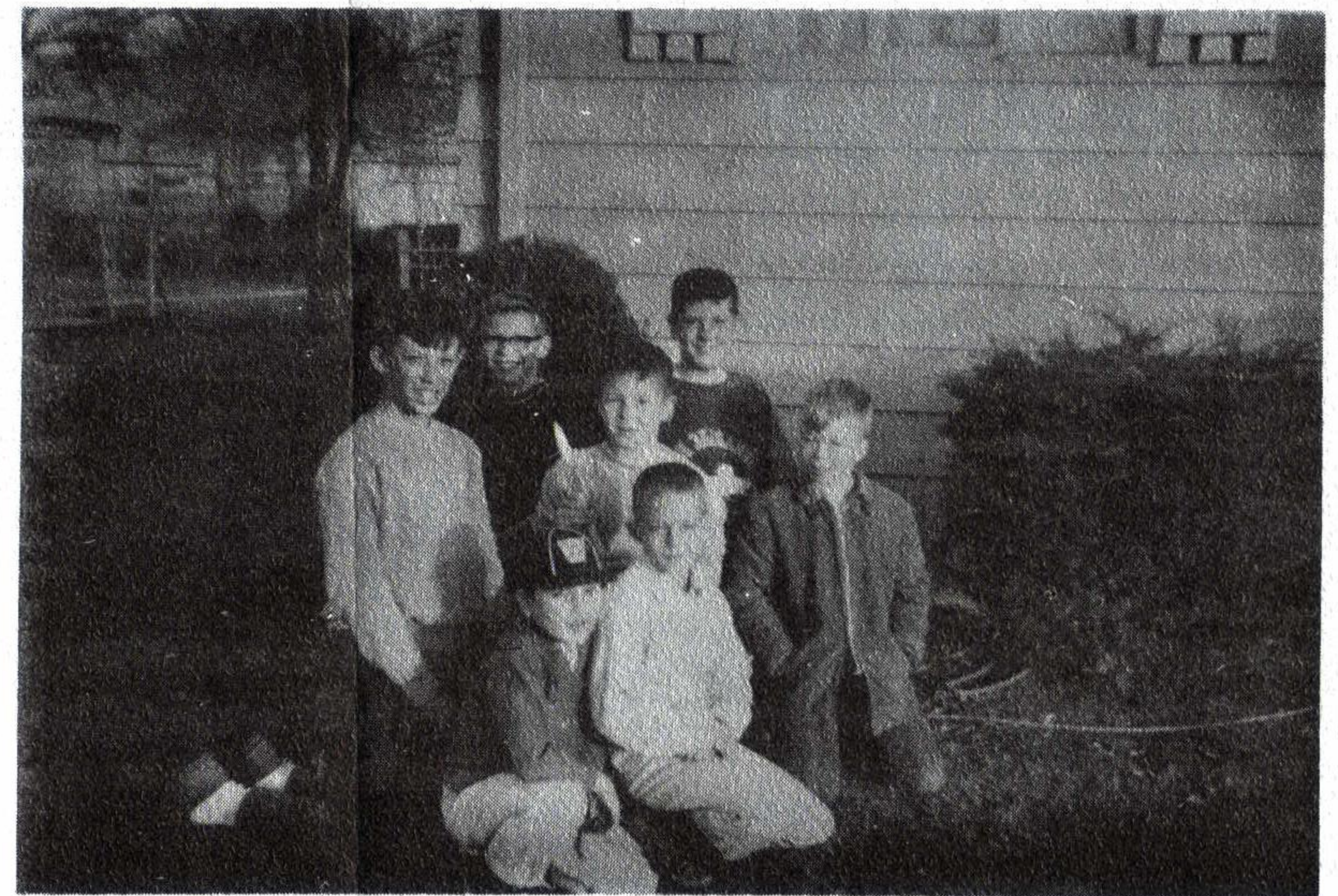
The men in the machine shop would be interested in a pie eating contest. Would you? ?
