"The multi-stage, yellow rocket stood poised as 13 year-old Mark Falbo completed the countdown. He connected the firing system, electrically igniting the rocket's propellant. The rocket hissed and sprinted from its fire-red pad into the clear sky.

The launching was the latest made by the Hazardville youngsterwho already has fired 14 rockets in the past 16 months. The rocket, a miniature Delta, carried a camera capsule which took an aerial photo-

graph of Mark's neighborhood from a 2,500-foot altitude.


