**DID YOU KNOW?** According to the records of Les Shaefer (Custodian) we drink over 5,000 cups of coffee every two weeks here at the plant.

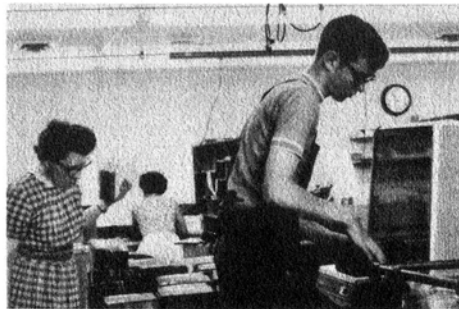
Ben Tade (Machine Shop) is back to work following the removal of a cataract from his eye. Ben reports that he is getting along well.

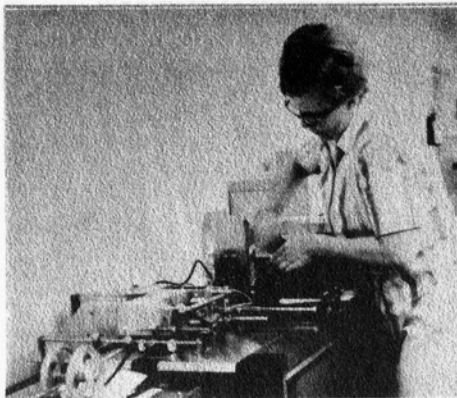
Zip coded bundles are secured by the tying machine then placed in the proper mail sacks. These in turn are taken by the warehousemen to the Penrose Post Office.

The Scriptomatic machine automatically addresses the order forms. These addresses are positioned so they will be visible through the clear window in the catalog envelope when they are inserted. The addressing machine is capable of handling 6,000 address cards an hour.
